Drinking Water Plant and Sewerage System -----ICONIC Project, Rotary Club of Surat

Niyol is a village situated approximately 13 km away at the outskirts from Surat city, located in Palsana taluka of Surat district, with a population of 5000 to 6000 villagers dwelling today.

21 years ago in the year 2001, the population of Niyol village was around 4000 people and was not included in the Surat Municipal Corporation area limit as it is much today. The village did not have a proper drainage and sewerage system and clean drinking water infrastructure facilities. The dwellers use to suffer from local and contamination illness diseases frequently as part of immune compromise, due to an unhygienic surrounding lacking drainage system and potable drinking water.

Rotary Club of Surat members came to know about the problem through a friend who was a NRI resident with roots at Niyol. RC Surat identified the requirement of much needed infrastructure and decided to equip this village. The Club decided to construct the underground sewerage drainage system and install the mineral water plant.

The Drinking water project was executed in year 2004, under Matching Grant project, today known as Global Grant Program, with the support from RC Elmira Heights, RID 7120, USA in collaboration with The Niyol Village Public Charitable Trust-USA, a trust run by NRIs who belong to same village.


A 50,000 litres capacity storage Mineral Water tank was installed wherein 4000 villagers were benefited as they got potable drinking water at a cheap rate of Rs.2/- per litre. The water tank has capacity to serve the growing population of 10,000 to 12,000 people in the village even today. For the past 17 years the potable drinking water has been supplied to every household in Niyol village.

The foundation stone of Mineral water - drinking water plant was laid by Trustee Mark Maloney and PRIP. Kalyan Banerjee in presence of then Director RI. Sushil Gupta laid the foundation stone of the sewerage project. PDG. HimanshuThackar was instrumental in setting up both these projects. The cost of these projects was approximately USD 55000\$.

An underground sewerage system has also been constructed for the entire village. Nivol became the first village two decades ago wherein an underground sewerage system was constructed. The villager's suffering of contamination and water borne diseases reduced drastically as the village got equipped with the needed infrastructure.

These projects are the most iconic as it was presented at Rotary International Convention, USA as one of the Sustainable and maintained projects of Rotary International by PRIP Mark Maloney. On their visit to Rotary Projects at Surat in 2019, PRIP. Mark Maloney and Gay, were happy to see the project till date, still maintained, functional and taken care by villagers with help of Surat Municipal Corporation as Niyol, today is in local municipal limits.

Rotary Foundation looks for the work done by them to be sustainable and plans for long term success. Both of these projects continue to benefit the beneficiaries even after their exit from projects laid. Rotary Club of Surat feels proud and glad to lay the foundation of this sustainable project, memorizing 22 years of past journey.
