## **Graduation Day & Women Empowerment Program at RNVTC**

Rotary Nele Vocational Training Center (RNVTC) celebrated Graduation Day on 28 Aug 2021. The occasion was to award certificates to all trainees who had completed 6 months tailoring skill training and 3 months of computer training in Office Management, Tally ERP & GST skills. In all a total of 95 trainees were awarded certificates having successfully completed their respective courses. The number of successful trainees in tailoring were 30, in Computer Office Management were 30 and in Tally ERP GST 35, a total of 95. Since inception 15 years ago, the center has served women in LAGGERE SLUMS benefiting 2358 in tailoring skills, 729 in office management & 47 in Tally ERP GST. The program was attended and addressed by District Vocational Services Director Rtn Arun Belur. PDG Rtn Madhura Chatrapathy was Chief Guest. PDG Madhura an entrepreneur herself comes from a modest background and no opportunity for initial formal schooling achieved enormous success as industry leader in custom food ingredients. She achieved great success in empowering entrepreneurship among women and shared her rich experience with women trainees of our Vocational Training Center. Program was well attended by 75 women and 20 Rotarians and 10 guests.

After Graduation Day function, Mahila Samavesha, a women empowerment program for women trainees of RNVTC followed for full day. There were sessions and discussions on opportunities for women to supplement family income by taking up small activities during their free time without disturbing any of their family responsibilities and routine. A session on family values from external faculty followed. Post lunch, a video on service activities. Q&A session, feedback, summing up and valedictory followed.

## **Speaker meet - Significance of NINE to Mankind - Rtn. P Gururaj**



On 1st September, a speaker meeting was organized at Vijayangar Club on the topic "Significance of Nine to ManKind A collection of facts" which was presented by our own Rtn Purush-otham Gururaj.

It was a comprehensive presentation which tried to explain What is there in number NINE? and gave specific examples on how Number NINE has a special status to ManKind over all other numbers.

Number NINE gains its importance which dates back to over 5000 years. Every major religion in this world – Hindus, Buddhists, Sikhs, Jains, Chinese, Christians, Muslims all have kept utmost faith in Number NINE. Nine is the largest single digit number Nine represents WISDOM, COMPLETION, ENERGY as per Numerology





He explained in depth Significance of NINE in Hinduism. Some of them were :

**The Bhagavad Gita** – the sacred book for Hindus has 18 Chapters. Sri Kurukshetra War: lasted for 18 days Kurukshetra War Formationswas fought with 18 different formations - Nava Dwara. Puranas depict that Vaikunta has NINE doors.. Vishnusahasranamam has 108 verses -

An Healthy Adult Breathes (basis of LIFE) - average  $108 \times 100 - 10800$  times ( Derives to NINE) during Sunshine and Moonshine period. - Total will be 10800 + 10800 = 21600 breaths, related to Hamsa Mantra (2+1+6+0+0=9)

Moon Drifts 10% of 108 – moves towards Earth - Earth starts to Wobble High Tides during Full Moon and New Moon days For LIFE Moon should follow the Ratio of 108 Sun has to follow the Ratio of 108 It is the NUMBER OF NATURE. The number NINE never diminishes, changes and never transforms to another form. (The product of any number with 9 adds back to 9).

Chindambara Rahasya: The Chidambaram Temple in Tamil Nadu of Lord Nataraja is a great example of how important and significant number NINE. The complete construction of the temple at every part represents the human body. The temple has NINE Dwaras based on NINE entrance or Openings of a Human Body. The temple roof is made of 21600 gold sheets is derived considering the below formula 15 X 60 X 24 = 21600, denotes the average number of breaths a human being takes every day adding to 9. 21600 gold sheets are fixed on the Gopuram using 72000 gold nails representing the total number of Nadis (Nerves) in a human body. The Gopurum is studded with NINE Kalashas represents the NINE Shakthi.

## Significance of NINE in Pure Science

All precious metals such as Platinum, Gold, Silver are measured with Purity. This purity system is called 'Millesimal Fineness' – the metals are said to be 'ONE NINE FINE' meaning 900 fine OR 90% pure. The metals are also described as 99% pure – two NINE's or 999 pure – three NINE's. NINE is considered as Logarithmic Scale for Purity, This measure is used across Pure Science to identify the Purity of any process / metals / systems etc.,

The presentation also dwelled on the significance and importance of nine in other civilizations reflecting the depth of research and it was too short a time to do justice to the topic and scale of preparation. In all it was an exceptional presentation and RBV is proud to have Rtn. P Gururaj in our midst.

## **Speaker Meet - "Maintenance of Four Wheeler" - Rtn. Dhiren Mehta**







keeping the season ahead in mind whether summer or winter.

On 15th September, a weekly meeting was held at Vijayanagar club, which was addressed by our own Rotarian Dhiren Mehta. He spoke on the topic "Maintenance of Four Wheeler" in which he explained about the important aspects to be kept in mind for better maintenance of four wheelers by giving practical tips. He also patiently answered the queries raised by the members who were present in good numbers. Introduction of the speaker was done by Rtn. Prabhu Shankar. Rtn. Dhiren Mehta has been in this business since the last 3 decades and is now a part of the elite panel on Electric Vehicles.

Rtn. Mehta said he wanted to bring attention to some simple yet essential aspects which play an important role in the maintenance of the vehicle as buying a good vehicle alone does not guarantee performance. Using a good Lubricant results in reduction in maintenance cost of the vehicle. Since ours is a tropical climate periodical checks of Air filters is critical as lack of it could have an impact on mileage and fuel efficiency. He suggested a clean up Every 5000 kms.

Another important aspect ignored is the vehicle maintenance which has two categories such as periodical maintenance and Seasonal maintenance. Periodical maintenance included Filter cleaning, Oil change, Braking system checking and correction. Seasonal maintenance was to prepare the vehicle

Another important item which needed special attention was Tyres. Consumers fall for lower prices but end up paying more due to shorter lifespan of the typres, so it is important to pay attention to quality as tyres despite being new sometimes could be already old due to storage for a longer time. He advised not to drive above the speed rating to prevent tyre burst and it is mentioned in every tyre. Every tyre has a road rating such as speed rating, V rating and speed rating ranges from 140 to 270 so it is better to be aware of it and stick within the limit. Another simple trick is to Fill nitrogen to keep the tyres cooler. Tyre pressure should not be ignored as it affects everything be it speed, road grip and of course mileage.

It is important to check wheel alignment periodically to get the best out of good tyres. He added that Engine Oil too plays a critical role so it should be chosen carefully. He advised to idle the vehicle for at least two minutes to allow the electrical systems and the combustion system to get activated before accelerating the vehicle, every time while starting the vehicle in the morning or after a break. As the vehicles have become modern, they rely on Electrical systems for most of the functionalities hence battery check up is a must for electrical systems to deliver.

Looking ahead he agreed that there's a shift towards electrical vehicles. However factors like charging points, life of batteries, cost of batteries all remain issues but are being addressed. He saw good potential for hybrid vehicles in the interim. He hoped in this dynamic sector where change is constant there will be better vehicles in the coming years

Meeting ended with Rtn. Shashie Mouli providing the "lasting laugh". In all it was enlightening to listen to Rtn. Dhiren Mehta and it is a matter of pride for RBV to have such a domain expert in our midst.
