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PCKG SCHOOL PROJECT - DELIVERING RESULTS



PCKG (Pathippaga Chemmal K Ganapathi) Government Higher Secondary School is a 70-year-old institution located on Arcot Road, Kodambakkam. Our association with this school started in 2020 when PP MC Srikanth and PP Magdoom identified this school for the rainwater harvesting project. Later in 2021, PP Magdoom was instrumental in providing them with a computer lab with the CSR funds from Mitsubishi and computers from Ford.

During early 2022, Rtn V Shankar proposed to take up a few government schools and work on their overall improvement. We roped in Kalanjiyam Trust as our associate and started the implementation in July 2022. Kalanjiyam has been working with government schools for over 2 decades.

The project aims to enable the students of this school to develop their full potential through improved knowledge and skills so that they can become successful members of their communities. The project aims to implement interventions that can help the students to improve academic performance, life skills and social skills, and improve chances of future employment / economic well-being.

Under this project, seven resource persons are permanently placed in the school. This includes a counselor, teachers in English speaking, Computer Science and remedial teachers in various subjects. Every quarter "the Star of the quarter' award is presented to the best performing students as an added motivation.

Government schools follow an all-pass rule till the 9th std. This has resulted in poor reading, writing and arithmetic skills among the students. Finally, they fail to pass the 10th std exam and end up as dropouts. By this project, we wish to ensure a 100% pass in the 10th / 12th std.

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SOUTHERNERS SOAK IN THE ONAM SPIRIT

Our club members have been celebrating Onam, the harvest and cultural festival of Kerala, every year with great enthusiasm. This year was no different. On 3rd September around 75 Southerners invaded the beach house of Rtn Sujeesh and Ann Sunitha at Nemmeli on ECR to participate in the special family participation event organised by our club. PP Rtn Shyamala, echoed the feeling of every Southerner who was present there with the following message (excerpt) which she shared soon after the event.
