# LOOKING BACK - JOURNEY DOWN THE MEMORY LANE



At the outset I whole heartedly thank our Editor – the Committed & Dedicated – Rtn. NANDAGOPAL, for giving me this opportunity to look back – literally and figuratively – at the Rotary Year 1995 – 96, when I was privileged to be the President of our beloved RBV.



The year 1995 – 96 literally began on a 'shaky foundation' with just 17 Rotarians as the previous Rotary Year 1994-95 saw more than

half of our Rotarians leave to form anther Rotary Club. To put in a nutshell it was a 'vertical split'. With just 17 Rotarians I had no problem of choosing the Board of Directors as all of them were Members of the Board of Directors 1995-96. At the end of the year our Membership Strength had shot up to 35 with the induction of 18 new members. One of the pillars of Membership Development was our Rtn PP K.T. SHETTY, who introduced

innumerable new members. Two of the Rotarians inducted in 1995-96 have turned out to be Star Rotarians of our RBV – RTN. PP KETAN SHAH & RTN PP NANJUNDA POOJARY.

One of the noteworthy projects conducted by us in 1995 – 96 was publication of JAGRUTHI – a Consumer Awareness Bulletin – which was distributed by us to all house-holds in and around Vijayanagar – through newspaper delivery boys – and also at Kempe-gowda Bus Stand and City Railway Station. In the accompanying photograph you can see our Rtn PP K T SHETTY distributing the same at Bengaluru Bus Stand. 4 four such bulletins were released during the year thereby creating an awareness about RBV too.



A first of its kind project in the Rotary World – RYLA exclusively for the Visually Impaired – was conducted by us in association with the National Association for the Blind. For the benefit of new Rotarians RYLA means Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, which is basically a



Leadership & Personality Development Camp. This project was widely appreciated with wide coverage in the Rotary magazine.

We also reached out to the community at large with a grandiose POLICE – PUBLIC MEET wherein the the then Commissioner of Police SRI SREENIVASULU and then DCP (West) PRAVEEN wide publicity given to this meet a good number of aitigans participated in the meeting. The then

SOOD – current DGP – participated. With wide publicity given to this meet a good number of citizens participated in the meeting. The then District Governor RTN. NAGARAJ GUPTA too graced the occasion.

This is a brief view of 1995-96. Before the commencement of the year the District had almost written us off, we were referred to as Ruins of Vijayanagar. We silently proved them otherwise and we are here to stay.

The first weekly speaker meeting of the club was held on 14th July 2021 at Hotel Nisarga. Mr. Mahesh Babu Managing Director of UFO Biosol India Pvt Ltd spoke on the topic "Polluted Water Treatment by Bioremediation". Rtn. Prabhu Shankar introduced the speaker.

Mr. Mahesh Babu is an Australian national and an Electrical Engineer with a post-graduation in Power Electronics. He is involved in various International Tech transfers to India such as Water aeration system to lakes – Floating fountains under JICA grants and Atmanirbhar Bharat, Polluted water BioRemediation at Mumbai India, Soil detoxification and Microbials concoction to control soil pH and improve NPK for organic plantation in Agri/ Horticulture and Floriculture, Biotech for Fish farming to reduce the Ammonia content in water.

Currently is involved in treatment of highly toxic Leachate from the solid waste processing plants under BBMP using Bioremediation technology. The technology is unique with the use of Probiotics Enzymes with cow dung base and microbial culture with Natural extracts. He is executing the Green Mysore Project in association with GSS Plantations to plant 200000 trees in and around Mysore City. He is very closely working with BBMP to clean the sewage water being let out to Vrishabhavathi river near Kengeri Bangalore.

He demonstrated how the foamy Bellandur Lake can be free from foam in 10 months using Probiotic Enzyme treatment. His concept of clearing sewage drains flowing across length and breadth of the Bangalore city to BBMP is under study. He proposed special eco-friendly nets to trap the debris in sewage drains followed by Enzymatic treatment so that sewage water becomes free from all toxic substances, a concept demonstrated at Sion Lake in Mumbai.

He proposed to Rotary to partner as a part of their community development initiatives in this project He also shared the project cost for phase wise implementation of cleaning of these sewage drains. Mr. Mahesh Babu's talk was fact based and analytic in approach thus evoked a barrage of questions such as, since Sewage canals keeps getting polluted continuously and how the enzyme treatment can contain the same? How can the enzymes clean such polluted water? What is the lifetime of these enzymes and period of repeat treatments? Etc., It was patiently and scientifically clarified.

The Constitution and Bylaws of RBV provides for a succession plan of Leaders, for the smooth functioning of our club. The President and The Board of Directors of our club are elected every year who will be responsible, to pursue the object of Rotary, carry out successful service projects based on the 6 avenues of service, contribute to the advancement of the rotary by strengthening membership, support the rotary foundation and develop leaders beyond the club level.

Rotary being an association of Business and Professional Leaders, the Rotary President is a Leader of Leaders. As Rotary carries out Community related services and Projects, the Rotary President is also the Leader of the communi-

ty. As such the position of Rotary President calls for High Ethical Standards and practices, very high responsibilities and commitments.

The President of RBV is elected almost 2 years before he assumes the position. Therefore the President gets enough time to Learn, understand and Plan his year very effectively. Let's understand this in a little more detail with an example....

The next President of our Club Rtn Ravishankar has been elected in 2019 to take over during 2022-23. During the Current year (ie 2021-22), Rtn Ravishankar is the "President Elect".

In the Board Meeting to be held in November 2021 The President Elect is appointed as the returning officer to Elect "The Board of Directors "for 2022-23, after the process of Elections the team will be Presented in the Club Assembly to be held in December 2021. This team will get about 6 months time to plan their activities and take over from the new Rotary Year starting 1st July 2022.

The positions to be filled by the President Elect will be – Vice president (President during 24-25) and Office Bearers for 2022-23 ie.. Club Secretary, Jt Secretary, Treasurer, Avenue Service Directors, Sergeant at Arms

Rotary Work is teamwork, All these Directors / Office Bearers have specific duties relating to their avenue of services, which they are supposed to perform, thereby enabling the President to Run the club activities for the Rotary Year smoothly.

Besides the above members, the President will also have in his Board - Immediate Past President .

President Elect i.e. Rtn Nanda Gopal (to take over during 2023-24), Additional Directors.

Each of the Avenue of Services will also consist of various Functional Committees headed by a Chairman, to formulate and Execute Projects after due approval of the Board, for the benefit of the Society at Large. These committees will be formed by the President Elect In discussion with the Avenue Directors,

The training programme for the President by the District called Pre PETS (President Elect Training Seminal) starts sometimes during September / October of the Previous Year and are normally held month after month. A total of about 8 to 10 Pre PETS will be held before the final PETS sometimes in June. SETS – Secretary Elect Training Seminar and TETS – Treasurer Elect Training Seminar, for the Secretary and the Treasurer will also be imparted training during May / June to help them understand their duties better and facilitate easy execution.

Pre PETS and PETS are important and it is worth attending by each President Elect to know Information about Rotary International Plans and Programs, Understand District Grants and Plans and Programs, Fellowship and Connect with the District Governor and the District Team, Plan Participation in ICGF's and Conference, Information about Projects being planned by various clubs, Opportunity to explore Joint Projects with clubs and or District, Contact with a number of Illustrious Speakers, Connect with Resources / Fund raising programs etc, Fellowship and connect with Co-Presidents and families.

The PRESIDENT will Generally be Installed along with all his Board members during the 1st Club Meeting, which is called the Installation meeting. All the office bearers In rotary i.e. the President, Directors and Committee members hold position for only one year, the idea is to give opportunity to every member of the club to participate, explore and experience Social Service. Every Rotarian needs to take advantage of this opportunity and participate in order to get the best out of him and mature into a Good Community Leader.



**Eligibility of the President:** As already said, Rotary is an association of Leaders, hence it is believed that every member has GOT in him the ability to Lead and perform in the Best Interest of Rotary keeping in mind the Rotary values, Ethics and Rotary Protocol.

Nevertheless, for better functioning before taking over as the President- He should have served the club at least as the Treasurer, Secretary, Editor, At least Director of One avenue, Should have actively participated in other Avenues of Service either as a Chairman / committee member or otherwise.

#### **Projects:**

By default it is the responsibility of each of the avenue directors to plan and execute activities and projects in their respective avenues.

All said and done, it is worth remembering that Rotary is a part time NGO, that means the first Priority of the members are for their business, the second Priority is their family and then comes Rotary. In other words Rotary is last in the Priority list. Hence the president has to continuously communicate, interact and motivate team members to carry out the projects and activities. The President also has to remember that Rotary clubs are President Driven Clubs, meaning - "The Club will be as active as the President of the club ", therefore the President has to Plan his other activities and decide to be active during his Presidentship.

By experience it is always better that the President should utilize his Pre- Presidentship period to chalk out his plan of action, formulate goals, projects, schedule of events, Resources, District events and Programs which he would like the club to participate in, etc in respect of each avenue of services. Once his team is formed he would only like to add or delete in discussion with the Avenue Directors and get into action right from day One, because even before he realizes the 365 days of his Presidentship would just fly.

To Conclude- Rotary President ship is a wonderful opportunity to explore and experience one's Level of IQ and leadership qualities. Simply said a LEVEL HEADED person with COMMON SENSE who is able to take his team along, having the knack of involving the Past Presidents and Members, including the Interactors, Rotracters and Innerwheel to Participate would SUCCEED as a GREAT LEADER.

A Weekly Meeting on the topic "Know Your Club" an orientation program on programs and processes of the club, was organized on 11th August 2020 at Vijayanagar Club was addressed by Rtn. PP P.V. Rai. Rtn. PP Nanjunda Poojary welcomed the gathering and introduced the speaker of the day by giving a brief about his profession as well as his long journey in RBV as a member, avenue director, secretary, President and various posts held in the district including the current role as Zonal Governor Zone A. Rtn. PP P.V. Rai commenced the meeting with a disclaimer urging members not to take to heart any pointers personally as it was being done for the improvement of the functioning of the club. His talk encapsulated the evolution of Rotary and RBV while focusing on the points that need attention to revive the journey ahead. He said Fellowship, Integrity, Diversity, Honoring Past, Embracing the future are values through which we can evolve and thrive. The focus of Rotary is on increasing impact, expanding reach, enhancing engagement and Ability to Adapt. He also noted that Leadership by Rotation is one of the cornerstones behind the survival of Rotary. Retain & Expand, Implementation of successful Service Project, Raise Money, Develop Leaders are the key attributes of an effective club he noted.

Shifting focus on RBV he pointed out that we have a legacy and it needs to be carried on. He urged to Plan & Execute while asking the Avenue Directors whether they were planning? He urged the Weekly meetings to start on time, be disciplined, follow protocol, have a clear agenda as these things will make a good first impression for a new member and guests who attend. It is important to assign roles with a clear brief.

Earlier we used to struggle to raise funds, now it is easier to raise from CSR funds of Corporates he recalled. He suggested to budget projects properly and take approval in advance and plan projects matching the designated months based on focus areas. He also noted that there is an emphasis on Public Image of late as it helps in getting funds and as well as attracts prospective rotarians.

He suggested assigning mentors for each of the new rotarians to groom them and requested members to attend district conferences. He said while in Rotary service is though voluntary, one is expected to do justice having taken up any responsibility. He urged the members to go prepared for the Board Meetings for make it constructive. He felt that a strategic planning committee consisting of Past Presidents and Future Leaders should plan the way ahead. He recalled the Rotary Founder Paul Harris quote "Whatever Rotary may mean to us, to the world it will be known by the results it achieves." and concluded the well attended meeting to which Rtn.
