NOVEMBER IS ROTARY FOUNDATION MONTH

Rotary Foundation (India) is also registered with the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) and hence, fulfills the eligibility criteria to act as an implementing agency for undertaking CSR activities. In partnering with corporates, the Rotary Foundation (India) works diligently to try and establish partnerships that are aligned with the core principles of the company/foundation.

All service projects are designed and implemented by members of community-based Rotary Clubs to ensure sustainability and maximise the results of their work. Given Rotary's profile and humanitarian efforts throughout India, the Rotary Foundation (India) has now expanded its partnership base by cultivating corporate relationships for CSR projects and implementing sustainable and impactful humanitarian projects through Rotary clubs/districts. RF(I) started its Pan India CSR operations in October 2016.

Rotary Foundation (India) is also registered under the Foreign Contribution and Regulation Act (FCRA) with the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India.

OFF TO A GOOD START - RCMS STUDENTS SCHOLARSHIP PROJECT

President Bina Boaz announced a few weeks ago about the students' scholarship project, supported by Acsys Investments. Close to 250 students from 7 identified schools have applied for the scholarship. The committee in charge of the project scrutinised the applications and approved the list of students we will support. As the next step, a visit to the schools to meet the students and parents and announce the confirmed scholarship was set in motion.

On October 28th PP Magdoom and Ann Rajeena met the students and parents of Baynes School, Vepery, and

announced the scholarship to 17 selected students who had come with their parents. "I addressed them on what is Rotary, why and how we do this project, and how we evaluated the applications. When I read out the amount sanctioned for each student, there was thunderous applause and several sparkling eyes," said Magdoom after his visit. A project to help shape the future of the less privileged children around us.

President Bina subsequently also visited the Manuelmony Matriculation School in Thiruvanmiyur and announced the scholarship for 20 selected students.





CYBER AWARENESS SESSION FOR SCHOOL STUDENTS



A session on "Using the Internet safely" was conducted for the students of PCKG Govt Hr. Sec. School, Kodambakkam, organised by our project partner Kalanjiyam Trust. A vocational service programme offering home nursing skills to 12 female students at ANEW, the Vocational Skills NGO was sponsored by our Club and the classes were inaugurated in October 2023. At a simple function held at their centre, our Club President Bina Boaz inaugurated the course as the chief guest. Rtn. Rajan Babu, vocational service director of the Club was the guest of honour and organised the programme. This 6-month programme will equip the students to work as home nurses and give them gainful employment upon completion.
