Asha Chethana project is a hand holding project for Asha and Link workers of RBV managed pulse polio centres. During the first leg of the project on 23rd October we distributed Ration kits to 20 Asha and 16 Link workers and 4 others staffs at Chord Road PHC. Total 40 nos. Worth Rs.40000. Total 9 Rotarians participated during the distribution function.







In the 2nd leg of the project RBV is intended to give Educational scholarships to around 10 to 12 children of Asha workers worth about Rs. 2 to 3 lakhs.
