LIFE, LOVE, TRUTH AND PAIN

This may look like a story and Shyam as an imaginary person. Any medico will have such stories to tell.

It was about 2 pm and Shyam was gazing through the window. The river flowing behind the hospital was always a refreshing thing to see, at this time he seldom used to see any living thing along the banks, but the boredom he was going through was so intense that he desperately wanted to see some living being freely moving in the outside world.

Last 3 days he is on ICU duty, as he had to cover his friend who had taken emergency leave to take care of his sick child.

Boring routine rounds, scolding from senior doctors, and demanding bystanders, he was getting exhausted. but sorry figures of patients came to his mind. Despite all human efforts, death still evaded them.

“death is my friend sitting opposite and smiling at me always”, he remembered the words with agony. His mind went back to the night some days back. Patient at the far back corner gestured him and started coughing a few times.

Reading his mind, the old man smiled weakly.

“doctor, sorry, for a moment I thought as if I am calling my grandson at home. That's why...” the old man was not able to complete the sentence, started coughing.

“uncle, take rest, we will talk later”

“no, my son, very little time left for me”

Shyam, stared at him. What is he meaning”

“death is my friend sitting opposite and smiling at me always”

മനുഷ്യൻ പരിചിതമായ നിരവധി കൃഷികൾ പണ്ടു കാലം മുതൽ ലോകത്തിന്റെ എല്ലാ ഭാഗങ്ങളിലും ഒരു തൊഴിലായി സ്വീകരിച്ച് മനുഷ്യൻ ചെയ്തു വരുന്നു. ഏറ്റവും പഴക്കമുള്ള തൊഴിലും അതു തന്നെ. എന്നാൽ ഇന്നും കൃഷിക്കാരന് സമൂഹത്തിൽ മാന്യമായ സ്ഥാനമോ, വരുമാനമോ ഇല്ലാത്ത അവസ്ഥയാണ്. ഈ സാഹചര്യത്തിൽ ലാഭകരമായ കൃഷി കണ്ടെത്തി സ്വന്തം ജീവിത നിലവാരം ഉയർത്തുക എന്നത് ഏതൊരു കൃഷിക്കാരന്റെയും ആവശ്യവും കടമയും ആയിരുന്നു. അത്തരത്തിൽ ഉള്ള ഒരു കൃഷിയാണ് തേനീച്ച വളർത്തൽ. തേനീച്ച വളർത്തലിന് നിരവധി മേന്മകളുണ്ട്.

മറ്റു കൃഷികളുമായി താരതമ്യപ്പെടുത്തുമ്പോൾ തേനീച്ച കൃഷിയുടെ പ്രധാന മേന്മ മുടക്കുമുതൽ അതേ വർഷം തന്നെ തിരികെ ലഭിക്കുന്നു എന്നതാണ്. മാത്രമല്ല ദീർഘകാലം (പതിറ്റാണ്ടുകളോളം) ചിലവ് ഒന്നും ഇല്ലാതെ തന്നെ ആദായം ഉണ്ടാക്കാം കാര്യമായ അധ്വാനശേഷി ആവശ്യമില്ലാത്തതിനാൽ തൊഴിലാളികളെ വച്ച് ചിലവ് ചെയ്യേണ്ടതില്ല. 50 പെട്ടിവരെ ഒരു കുടുംബത്തിന് പുറത്തുനിന്നുള്ള സഹായകന്റെ തുണയില്ലാതെ തന്നെ പരിരക്ഷിക്കാവുന്നതേയുള്ളൂ.

ഏതു കൃഷി ചെയ്യണമെങ്കിലും കൃഷി ഭൂമി വേണം. എന്നാൽ തേനീച്ച കർഷകന് സ്വന്തമായി ഒരു തുണ്ട് ഭൂമി പോലും വേണമെന്ന് നിർബന്ധമില്ല. മറ്റൊരാളുടെ കൃഷി ഭൂമിയിൽ തേനീച്ചപ്പട്ടികൾ വച്ചാൽ പ്രസ്തുത കർഷകനും ഗുണമല്ലാതെ ദോഷമൊന്നുമില്ല. തേനീച്ചകൾക്ക് തേനുണ്ടാക്കാൻ യാതൊരു വിധ അസംകൃതവസ്തുവും നൽകേണ്ട ആവശ്യമില്ല. പ്രകൃതിയിൽ നിന്നും യാതൊന്നിനോടും മല്ലിടാതെ, നഷ്ടപ്പെട്ടു പോകേണ്ടിയിരുന്ന മധുരത്തെ പൂവിൽ നിന്നോ, ഇലകളിൽനിന്നോ ശേഖരിച്ച് അവ നമുക്ക് തരുമ്പോൾ ഭൂമുഖത്തെ മനുഷ്യരാശിയുടെ ജീവൻ നിലനിർത്താനുള്ള ജൈവ പ്രക്രിയയിൽ അവ പങ്കുചേരുകയാണ്.

മനുഷ്യസമൂഹത്തിന് ഉപകാരം മാത്രം നൽകി സ്വന്തം ജീവിതം ഹോമിക്കുന്ന തേനീച്ചയെ ഇണക്കി വളർത്തി നമുക്ക് വ്യവസായികമായി ലാഭമുണ്ടാക്കാൻ കഴിയും.

Mushroom Capsicum Stir Fry

Ingredients

- Mushroom -500 gms
- Capsicum-1 Big
- Onion-2
- Green chilies -4-5
- Pepper powder-1 tsp
- Coconut oil
- Salt to taste



Preparation



- Wash and dry the mushrooms and cut into medium pieces.
- Then in a kadai add mushroom along with pepper powder and salt.
- Close and cook for 10 minutes in medium flame.
- Now open the kadai and cook till done.
- In another kadai add coconut oil and heat.
- Then add onion and green chilies along with salt and saute for 2 minutes.
- Then add capsicum and mix. Close the Kadai and cook.
- When 3/4th cooked, add mushroom and mix well.
- Cook for another 2 minutes.
- The stir fry should be dry. Check the salt.
- Add pepper powder and green chilies if required.

The Mushroom capsicum stir fry is ready to serve.
